

Requested Flexibilities: Minutes of Instruction TEC §25.081

Current Requirement:

School day must consist of 75,600 minutes of instruction, including intermissions and recesses, for students.

- a. Maintain standard of 75,600 minutes
- Immediate focus is on prekindergarten and High School of Choice scheduling needs
- Expand in the future for creative scheduling options to best meet individual student's needs

Requested Flexibilities: First Day of Instruction TEC §25.0811

Current Requirement:

School districts may not begin instruction for students for a school year before the fourth Monday in August, unless year round school is offered.

- a. Flexible start day that begins school before the fourth Monday
- b. Based on staff and community feedback
- c. Opportunity to balance school days within each semester
- d. Allows for varied professional development options to address individual staff, campus and district goals.

Requested Flexibilities: Seven Hour School Day TEC §25.082

Current Requirement:

School day shall be at least seven hours each day, including intermissions and recesses.

- Allows for innovative instructional options with less than seven hours, if needed
- District will maintain goal of maximum learning time. Reduction will be used selectively for targeted purposes only
- c. Opportunity to address individual student, campus and community needs

Requested Flexibilities: School Day Interruptions TEC §25.083

Current Requirement:

- a. Limited announcements, other than emergency announcements, to once during school day.
- b. Student may not be removed from a regularly scheduled class for remedial tutoring or test preparation for more than 10% of the school days.

- Allow decisions regarding announcements and interruptions to be made by campus administration
- Opportunities to alter a student's daily instruction to provide intervention and remedial tutoring as needed to best address needs
- c. Alternative instructional programming during school day, as needed.

Requested Flexibilities: Teacher Appraisal Process TEC §21.352

Current Requirement:

Appraisal process must include teacher's implementation of discipline management procedures and performance of teacher's students using state adopted appraisal system model or locally developed model. SLOs are to be implemented in 2017-2018 school year.

- a. Flexibility to maintain current TTESS model without implementation of state's final phase related to Student Learning Objectives
- b. Object is to maintain current district assessment and data analysis model
- c. Opportunity to implement data analysis in all areas over the next five years through work with staff in each teaching area


