Philip Gurke made a motion for approval of Minutes from the previous meeting. Rolando Gomez seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

At 11:35 a.m. the team entered into Closed Session by general consent and unopposed announcement of presiding officer pursuant to Section 551.076 of the Government Code to deliberate:

- Potential threats that have impacted campuses this school year;
- The District's multi-hazard emergency operations emergency operations plan (Crisis Management Plan) under 37.108 (a) of the Education Code; and,
- The tri-annual security audit of the district's facilities required under Section 37.108 (b) of the Education Code.

The Crisis Management Team reconvened into Open Session at 11:41 a.m.

## Discussion Items:

- Discussion of continued development of SRO program and security team under the leadership of Waxahachie Police Department Lt. Josh Oliver.
  - The SROs attended training done in house by WPD in February and March this included CPR training as well as training with ballistic shields
  - Security team recently had officers complete marshal certification have had people out but "rover" officers are able to cover campuses – officer evaluations have been sent to principals for overview of how the year went with the officer assigned to their campus and for input regarding security needs of their campus
- Discussion regarding lockdown, evacuation and reunification drill conducted at Waxahachie High School on March 11, 2022.
  - Overview given on how the drill went 141 students evacuated to the Waxahachie Civic Center, 7 City of Waxahachie and Ellis County employees present, over 70 WISD staff; only 4 minutes from time of parent check in until they were in the parent room awaiting reunification with their student; additional needs for future events: cell phone charging stations, radio communication between site and transportation, additional translators, as well as additional people for greeting and in the parent room.
- Discussion regarding safety drills at campuses pertaining to all hazards and threats.
  - General idea is that fire drills should be run monthly; when using the DIR-S app drills do tend to run smooth; app also has report running capabilities to see what campus drills have been done and when.
- Discussion regarding case studies and lessons learned from crises arising within other school districts.
  - Trends in suspects when researching shootings at school is that most are 14-15 years old; most of the shootings occur in the parking lot at sporting events; there is a minimal use of metal detectors on the campus; lack of training; all cases are generally male students and most occurred from a disagreement festering between students

- Discussion and possible action to recommend addition to multi-hazard operations plan related to potential train derailments.
  - o Jacob Perry made a motion to recommend the addition of information related to train derailments to the multi-hazard operations plan with a second from Tonya Harris. The motion passed unanimously.
- Discussion of WISD's response to COVID and update regarding current conditions.
  - WISD is in good way with COVID we are no longer doing a dashboard due to cases dropping to 0 by February; Support Services and Transportation are continuing to disinfect classrooms and buses through the remainder of the year.

Ginger Robinson made a motion to adjourn. Kam Bridgers seconded and the motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 12:31 p.m.
