- 2. Degree to which LEA has made progress toward meeting the Title IV, Part A objectives and outcomes. [ESSA Statute, Section 4106(e)(1)(E)]

LEA is required to annually provide:

- Description of Title IV, Part A activities/program objective and intended outcomes
- Description of how the LEA will periodically evaluate the effectiveness of the Title IV, Part A activities/programs
- LEA Assurance annually report how funds are being used to meet Title IV, Part A content area(s)

Important Notes about School Calendars

- Teachers must work 187 days
 - Having fewer days of instruction requires more
 Work Days or Professional Development days
- Expectations

- Flexibility
 - Start and End dates, Holiday Breaks, Early Release, Designated Professional Learning or Work Days

The meeting opened at 4:30 p.m. by Asst. Superintendent of Elementary Learning Lisa Mott. She reviewed the district's Core Values and reviewed the agenda items.

Federal Programs Director Christi Kubin reviewed Title II and Title IV budgets and went over current and proposed expenditures. The importance of stakeholder input was stressed and the various ways stakeholders can be heard. She then presented on the new Title IV, Part A Special Data Collection for Public Reporting including statutes, requirements and the reporting timeline.

Dr. Hollingsworth reviewed how important the bond proposal will be to our district and the importance of investing in our community.

Regarding the district calendar for the 23-24 school year, Dr. Hollingsworth asked that the committee keep in mind we develop a calendar that is best for students. Mrs. Mott led the discussion regarding the calendar. The district used the current calendar to create three calendar options. Bad weather days, Fair Day, Parent/Teacher conferences and Homecoming were considered. Each committee member was given a copy of the three proposed calendars. Mrs. Mott went over considerations for each option. Then, each table group worked together to record feedback on each calendar. Groups were instructed to record two things they liked about each calendar and one thing they'd like to add to each calendar.

The full committee was called back together at 5:30. A representative from each table group reported out their findings with the full committee. Any questions and concerns from the committee were discussed. Calendar Option #3 is the most popular. Mrs. Mott went over expectations for committee members to get campus feedback and record feedback on google doc. February 1, 2023 is the deadline to submit feedback. She will send each committee member one calendar option to share with staff and get feedback on that option. It was reiterated that the expectation is not to develop a new calendar option from scratch, but to make suggestions on the calendar option shared. The DEIC will meet again on February 2, 2023 to discuss feedback and make final changes to the calendar.

The meeting was adjourned by Mrs. Mott at 5:51 p.m.
